Meeting Came to Order at 5:00 pm

Dian Martin opened meeting by welcoming all committee members, teachers and industry partners.

Dian Martin gave PowerPoint presentation which included functions of the advisory committee, presentation to Velma Borrows for being this year's Golden Bell Award Winner for the PHS Medical Assisting Program, facilities update for Perris High School and Paloma Valley High School, funding opportunities and CDE Facilities Grant.

Each high school gave updates on their various CTE programs.

Velma Borrows presented the MSJC proposed Medical Assisting Certificate Programs which included Medical Assisting Administrative and Medical Assisting Clinical, with the option of combining both certificate classes and adding general education requirements to earn the Associate's Degree in Medical Assisting.

Velma Borrows presented the idea that students could complete 21-24 units in each certificate and would thereafter be equipped to work in a medical facility as a front or back office medical assistant. Velma Borrows asked the committee if creating two certificates of this manner was beneficial to students in giving students the opportunity to choose either front or back office, or both, or a degree pathway.

Anieno Ibekwe and Dian Martin and Dr. Charolette Barnes shared that they loved the idea of creating choices for students within the medical assisting program. Anieno Ibekwe motioned that the medical assisting certificates be created to meet student needs. David Sanchez seconded the motion.
