Students who are taking classes and working qualify for a stipend. \$8000.00 each year goes to New Horizons for the book lending library. We hope to be able to change that next year as we move to more Open Educational Resources. • A flyer was shared about a new program “Developmentally Appropriate Practices Intern” see attached. • Increasingly the Chancellor’s Office and locally at College of the Desert, support is being provided to adopt open textbook resources. Open educational resources (OER) are freely accessible, openly licensed text, media, and other digital assets that are useful for teaching, learning, and assessing as well as for research purposes. We are currently working to provide OER for all of our CORE 8 courses and as many of our electives as possible. • We have nearly completed the approval process for all of our courses (see attached plans). Our next step will be to submit all of our certificates and degrees. If all goes as planned, implementation will be for fall of 2020. • COD has been an Alliance member for several years. The program is expanding in California and there will be a training at COD on Thursday November 7th from 5:00-9:30 pm. (See Attached)

We have a meeting scheduled with grant organizers to brainstorm our next steps. This grant will develop a cohort model to bring 12 unit teachers to degree completion at work rather than having them try to come to college for all their classes. Thanks to private donations, we will be sending a cohort of 14-18 students to Costa Rica this summer for a Global Practicum Experience. (See attached)

<p>III.- Discussion / Feedback</p>	<p>*New/Revised Certificates</p> <p>*Changes to Lab Classes</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Change the name of the certificate. Family and Child Care implies that this is a position that will work in a childcare setting, and that is not the case. We recommend removing the term childcare and changing it to Children and Families 2. We reviewed the Program Learning Outcomes and Goals and Objectives and we had two further recommendations: 3. Remove the child guidance course and replace it with CDE 101, Child Growth and Development. We also thought that CDE 102, Child, Family and Community should be a good fit. If possible, an additional course to offer for the certificate would be CDE 228, Child Maltreatment. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Included in the packets (see attached) were the revised certificates. To better align with Guided Pathways we have met with our counselor liaison and articulation officer to create recommended general education course offerings that align with our degrees. We hope this will help students to graduate with minimum extra courses. • To better align with CSUSB as they move to semesters, we have added an additional unit to our lab course (CDE 204) the course will now be a two-unit lecture and a two-unit lab. Developmentally Appropriate Practices (DAP) Intern

College of the Desert's mentor teacher program is launching a new invitation to COD's early childhood alumni with at least two years of teaching experience across the Coachella Valley to spend a year walking alongside a California Early Childhood Mentor Teacher learning and enhancing your skills to teach children in a developmentally appropriate, play-based, child-initiated learning environment.

To be eligible for this program, the applicant must be:

- A graduate of COD's early childhood education program with an AA degree;
- Have completed ECE Practicum course with a mentor teacher at COD;
- Hold a CA Child Care Permit at the Master Teacher level or be eligible;
- Be a lead teacher in an early childhood education program in the Coachella Valley for at least two years.

The opportunity will include:

- Visits to each other's classrooms
- ECHERS and CLASS self-assessments to identify three goals for the project year
- Monthly connections in person, classroom visits, digital visits, phone calls, texts and e-mails
- Group learning sessions at COD with college instructors twice during the year
- Opportunities to attend training events as a group with planning before and debriefing afterwards
- Invitation to Mentor Teacher meetings twice during the school year
- Completion certificate at the end of the school year
- Field trip to out of area exemplary preschool classroom
- Additional activities that may arise

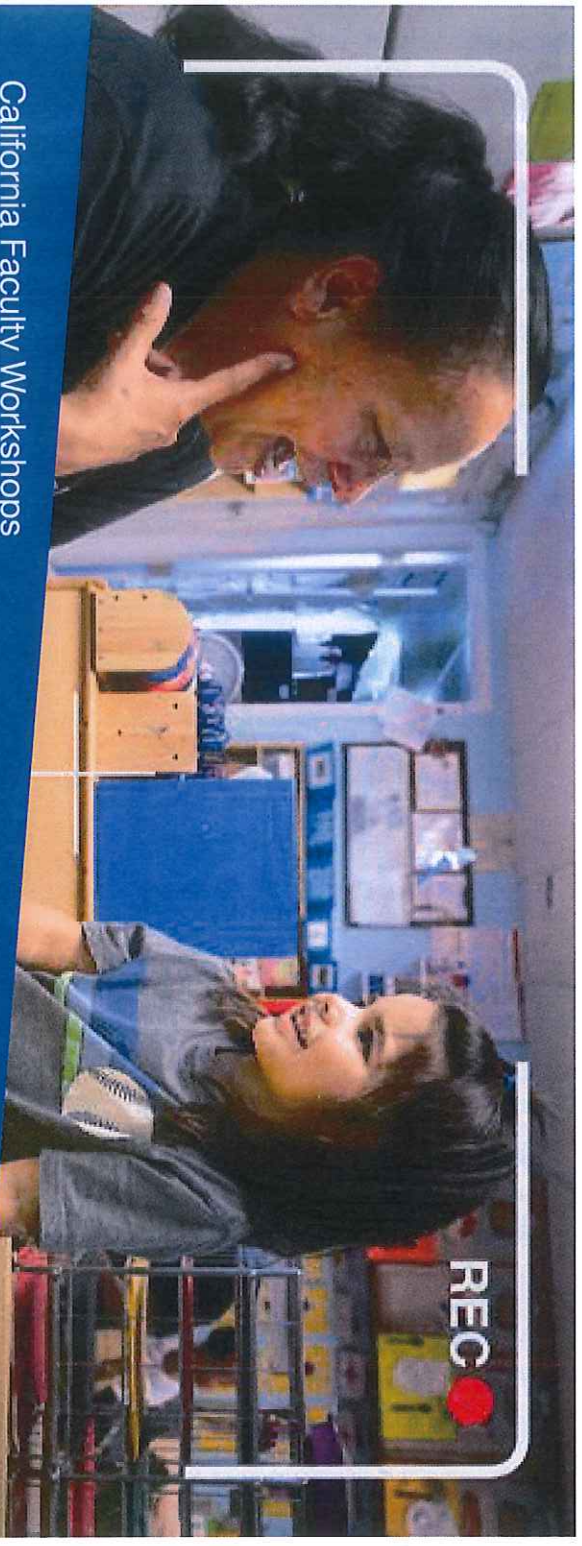

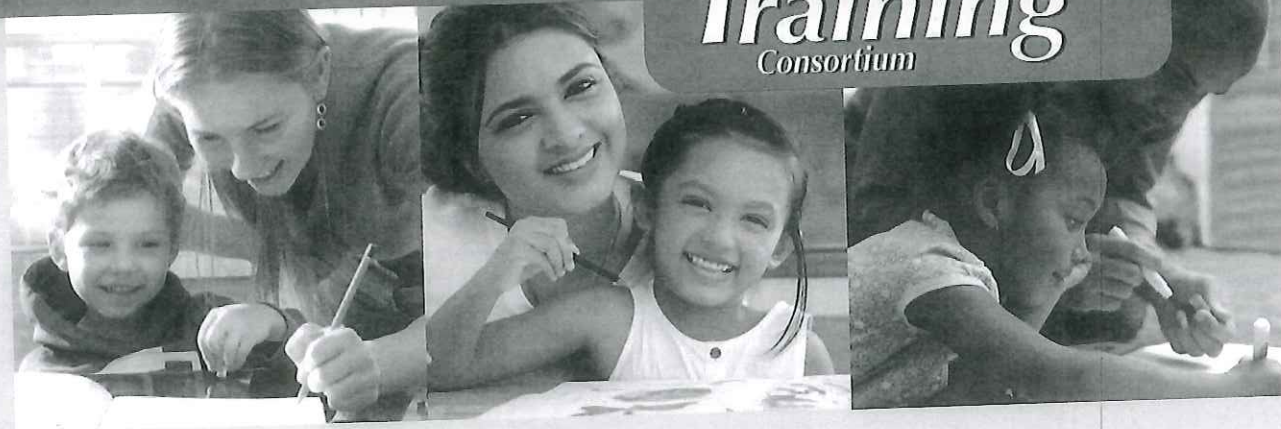
