Summary of Recommendation from last meeting

- Curriculum
 - The following will be added to the catalog this fall:
 - Adult Supervision or Administration class added to Preschool Teacher Certificate as an elective to help promote pathway to becoming a Director
 - "Select 2 courses from the following:" to the electives to provide ability to take these classes
 - Deleted A240, Inclusion, as it has not been offered in two years
 - Total units increased by 1 unit
 - We did not create a hybrid of an online class199 Special Topics class
 - Weekend offering on Inclusion strategies was successful
 - 28-30 students attended
 - Next 199 offering will be on Creating Group Time with Children
 - Two weekends in April
- New Equipment/Technology needs
 - None needed at this time

Program Recruitment

 Job postings are going up in classrooms and on department Facebook page as they're received seem to be working well

Other

- Upon recommendation of last year, during our practicum, 201 Field Experience, more teaching on entering and exiting play; understanding positioning in classroom as well as awareness of students
- Workshops for creativity learning; in class teacher preparation, focus on group time, parental guidance was also suggested coming in weekend class
- ECE Program student tutors/mentors to help students that need extra help
 - This is coming about with the addition of patio tables and chairs outside CSD 108 building classroom to help create space for students
- Laurie addresses this request at every opportunity:
 - Director's expressed a need for students to have better phone etiquette when calling to schedule projects or observations.

III. Review and Ratification of Program Level Outcomes (PLOs)

<u>Infant and Toddler Teacher</u>: The objective of the program is to meet the needs of the local child care programs by preparing students for lead-level employment as a professional and competent infant/toddler teacher.

<u>Associate Preschool Teacher</u>: The objective of the program is to meet the needs of the local child care programs by preparing students for entry-level employment as a professional and competent preschool teacher.

<u>Preschool Teacher</u>: The objective of the program is to meet the needs of the local child care programs by preparing students for lead-level employment as a professional and competent preschool teacher.

<u>Early Childhood Administration</u>: The objective of the program is to meet the needs of the local child care programs by preparing students for employment as a professional and competent child care director.

IV. Current Program Status and Updates

- Enrollment Trends
 - Majority of classes are full
 - o HMDV 182-Middle Childhood Development and Guidance consistently low
 - Not tied to a certificate
 - o Infant/Toddler are consistently low but is tied to certificate program
 - Admin online class is a little higher being offered online but not significantly
 - Have tried a hybrid class with Adult Supervision at Santiago Canyon
 - Believe that these types of classes need to be in-class
 - Really need to be able to manage and interact with people face-to-face
- Facilities/Equipment
 - Conversion of one of the men's bathrooms into an adult/child bathroom
 - Access with security card only distributed to designated personnel
 - Able to restart parent/toddler classes
- Curriculum
 - New partnership with our Adult Ed program with HBAS
 - Offering Child Growth and Development course off campus
 - Targeting parents of children to train parents to work in preschool program at nearby elementary school
 - HBAS is offering a free ESL class utilizing terminology for class
 - Child Family Community class being offered this summer
 - Courses are open to anyone
 - Take first 6 units at off campus site then complete at OCC
 - OCC ESL instructor developing ECE terminology curriculum

- New 24-unit certificate approved for Associate Preschool Teacher
 - Can also be a pathway for a Transitional Kindergarten teacher
- Associate Preschool Teacher certificate will provide an option for students to graduate with a certificate and gain employment in the field without having to wait to enroll in EC 201. Students will have the required units to work as a licensed preschool teacher in an entry-level position.
- o Conference coming up on April 28th presenting career options within field and music
- Student Outcomes—Not covered

 - Challenging to get money spent because students must be working in field to qualify for funds—most work as nannies
 - o Update given on Mentor Programs, Mentor Teacher and Director Mentors
 - Really need Infant/Toddler and Director Mentors
 - October 6th deadline for Spring 2019
 - Governor proposing fully online community college
 - CCCECE professional organization have put out position statement against proposal
 - 85 colleges offer online classes in addition to traditional
 - Of those 85 colleges, 80 make it able to earn first 12 units online for ECE certificate
 - Reduces program quality control
 - 25 colleges offer all classes online
 - ENC in Newport Beach is opening nature preschool next year
- Staffing/Hiring practices Not covered

 - Inclusion of special needs, using Regional Center
