Committee recommendations to benefit ELAC students:

- Administrative Recommendations:
 - o Provide more certificates and degrees in the legal field for students
 - Unanimous approval of "Legal Assistant/Paralegal Certificate"
 - Unanimous recommendation of Associate of Arts Degree in the Law
 - Provide real life work experience opportunities for students
 - Unanimous approval of pursuing Legal Aid Clinic administered by students with training and mentorship through partnerships with Legal Service Providers
 - Promote internships and shadowing of working professionals to develop skills
 - Apply an interdisciplinary approach to courses, eg. working with Administration of Justice Department to broaden course offerings
 - Create a "Law Club" for students to share ideas, knowledge and interest in the pursuing careers in all legal fields – attorney, paralegal, law enforcement, government/regulatory
- New Course Recommendations:
 - International Business Law (including emerging technology and E-commerce)
 - International Law (including business-based and family-based immigration)
 - Consumer Rights and Bankruptcy
 - Committee noted this would be important to students seeking a pathway to a Financial Advisor career
 - Criminal Law (including civil rights of criminal defendants)

V. OVERVIEW OF DISCIPLINES, EXISTING ACTIVITIES, AND MOTIONS

- Ted Collins Accounting
 - About the program

- About 2400 students a year
- In the last 4 years 64 Associate Degrees in Accounting, 10 Certificates of Achievement,
 519 Accounting Assistant Certificates, 94 Quick Books Certificates
- Need to get those numbers up, some students are not aware they qualify for a certificate and we need to find ways to let them know and get them to fill out the forms
- AICPA Chairwoman has a certificate of accounting from a community college listed under her education
- 6 Full time faculty members
- Success Factors
- Business Department Open House to engage students and let them know what courses the department offers and to meet faculty
- Two new courses Payroll and Ethics, good number of students enrolled. Ethics required for CPA, using open education free text to save costs
- Business and Entrepreneurship club merged into one and flourishing
- Accounting Club most successful club on campus, with access to speakers, networking, internship opportunities, and fieldtrips to other campuses and universities
- Internship with Downtown LA Motors
- Cross campus collaborations: VITA program, CAOT analytical data for financial reporting
- Future Forensic Accounting and Data Analysis
- Need to improve
- Use data from OIEA for better planning and scheduling of courses and improve student enrollment

- (3) Request for funding students to take the quick books certified credential. All in favor, no opposes, Motion Passed

Laura Ramirez – Business

- Business is in the top 10 majors for students so it is in high demand
- 2 Full time faculty and 10-15 adjunct instructors
- 1360 students enrolled this semester
- 10 Dual enrollment courses offered at high schools this semester allows students to achieve college credits early on
- Gina Chelstrom: awarded grant funding extended through 2019 and creating career pathway for high school students
- Draft of Business and Accounting Map for Pathway program at Garfield High school allows students to earn college credit and prepares the student for college. By following the map program the student can earn skill certificates and an AA in Accounting or Business Management. This program, while created for Garfield High school, can be offered to any other high school as well.
- Anderson Can we suggest to add Real Estate 001 to that program?
- This program can also expand to other disciplines.

- Arnold Ver Who teaches these courses?
- Dual Enrollment courses are taught by college instructors and offered after regular high schools hours
- Weaknesses
- Only 2 Full time Faculty
- Need to increase certificate completion
- Need to increase enrollment at Southgate campus
- High impacted majors at Cal State LA which will make it more difficult to get in –
 Accounting, Management, & Marketing
- Motions
- (1) To approve the International Business Management Certificate of Completion AA Degree for e-commerce and e-trade and the 1+1+2(1 year in their country, 1 year at ELAC, and two years at a University). All in favor, no opposes, Motion Passed.
- (2) To approve Basic Entrepreneurship Map program for pathways at High schools. All in favor, no opposes, Motion Passed.

VI. BUSINESS LEADER PERSPECTIVES

- Michael Huntley about 600 new jobs at the new Power Center off the 60 fwy in Monterey Park (Costco, Home Depot, InnOut, etc.) New Hotels in San Gabriel (Sheraton, Hyatt) also offering jobs. ELAC should consider offering hospitality and visitor accommodation courses. There is a great demand for young individuals in hotels and tourism. Internships for the city of Monterey Park some paid some unpaid to get work experience. Possible collaboration with Business Department and ELAC Career Center.
- Arlene Romero Non Profit agency Bank Works provides basic education in banking.
 Looking to hire individuals with personality not individuals with degrees who feel entitled.
 Job fairs once a quarter in different regions for hiring
- David Lau- Emphasized the importance of ethics in Real Estate, as well as how important it is for individuals to have personality too. Q. Possible impacts on foreign/international students due to new administration?
- Ramirez Reports on growth of international students, but numbers are still not in for this
 year. There has been almost a 40% decrease on financial aid submissions because many
 students are afraid to report. Meeting being held today as well on DACA to go over
 procedures on how to protect our current students, and what to do if ICE were to come on
 campus in regards to procedures, legalities, and rights since we do run on federal funds
 from the government so we need to make sure we stay in compliance.
