Updates

Glendale Community College

Child Development Department -

New AST Degree [Elementary Education] and Courses introduced: Child Development and Education Skill Awards [ECE I, ECE 2 and FCCP] Award range from 6-12 semester units, FCCP includes non-credit coursework in collaboration with our Garfield Campus and the non-credit Program. See attached for details.

GCC has also developed a Transitional Kindergarten Certificate to include two new courses CHLDV 101 Elementary Teaching and the new Math/Science Curriculum course to be approved by C & I this spring. This certificate is for those who may already be teaching in local school districts and includes a focus on planning developmentally appropriate curriculum.

As part of our OER project we developed a series of videos of children and teachers in the lab for use in the classroom. Videos are housed on 3C Media -the link will be made available to board members.

GUSD Partnership -GCC is partnering with GUSD to create a pathway from high school to the ECE workforce via GCC. Students will complete some course work as part of their high school program, complete a high school course that has been articulated with GCC and complete 6 units at GCC to earn the initial units required by CCLD to enter the workforce.

Non-Credit Partnership: the department continues to work with the Non-Credit ESL program and the Counselors on the Garfield Campus to build bridges and create resources to assist students who transition from the non-credit program to the Verdugo Campus and the CHLDV major. Currently looking at ways we can support English language learners with contextualized ESL courses.

Child Development Center -Accreditation/PITC Update
