4. Industry 4.1 Review Required Skills for Competency:	 Students are met with one on one for advising to discuss what is offered in both programs. A la cart courses give students flexibility. The board was asked if a Revit course should be added as a required course. Feedback was given that knowing Revit is needed for major Architecture companies in addition to AutoCAD. Knowledge of Revit is looked for on resumes. Students express the need to know more AutoCAD. Presentation work is desired but the technology side is missing. Holly believes that Revit should be added to the Associates Degree. An Advanced BIM/Revit (ARCH-290) class will be offered in the spring of 2020. Building Information Modeling (BIM) can be a bridge between Interior Design and Architecture. Industry: It is necessary for students to have critical thinking skills and creative skills to be able to participate effectively on projects and clearly in presentations/meetings. Augmented reality (AR) is becoming more and more important for Interior Design work. Rhino and Grasshopper are other important skills that are used in the field.
