- The following noncredit certificates of completion were discussed with the Board:
 - Adobe Photoshop Association Certification Exam Preparation

 - Digital Photographic Camera and Manual Exposure Fundamentals
 - Digital Photographic Project Fundamentals
- Industry members expressed that adding noncredit certificates of completion in Capture One and Trailblazing should be considered.
- Bobbi Lane stated that marketing oneself both as an assistant and photographer is important to learn.
- The noncredit certificates have been very successful.
- Darrell Walters suggested that the number of units be increased for the internship.
- Internships should be incorporated in the program sooner as opposed to the end of the second semester.
- The Photography Program is seeking to establish ongoing internships for students in the Commercial Photography industry and on campus in the GMD Intersect Lab.
- Bobbi Lane believes that students would benefit from completing a rotating internship with multiple professionals as opposed to working with only one person.
- Establishing relationships with various associations and organizations will help students to make connections.
- Cash Danielsen discussed the American Photography Association's Bridge Program, which allows underserved communities the opportunity for free portfolio reviews.
- Cash will look into the possibility of establishing internships for students through the American Photography Association.

	 Sej Saraiya will look into internship opportunities for students with the American Society of Media Photographers. It was suggested that Professional Photographers of America be contacted for internship opportunities. Students should be encouraged to attend networking events for various associations and organizations. Connecting students with Alumni may provide internship opportunities for them. Photography assistants should be invited as guest lecturers. It will be noted that a conversation should be had between the Photography and MEA Departments in regards to providing students with video editing skills.
