

# Surgical Technologists and Medical Equipment Preparers

Inland Empire/Desert Region (Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario Metropolitan Statistical Area)

#### **Summary**

- Employment for surgical technologists and medical equipment preparers is expected to
  increase by 22% through 2022. More than 1,000 job openings will be available over the
  five-year timeframe in the Inland Empire/Desert Region.
- The entry-level wage for surgical technologists and medical equipment preparers is above
  the MIT Living Wage estimate of \$12.30 per hour for a single adult living in the Inland
  Empire/Desert Region.
- Based on the average annual number of program completions for the selected community
  college programs (185 average annual other awards), and the annual openings for
  surgical technologists and medical equipment preparers in the local region (204 annual job
  openings), labor market demand appears to be nearly met by private institutions.

#### Introduction

The two occupations included in this report are listed below along with their definition/description, sample job titles, education and training requirements, as well as the community college educational attainment of workers within each occupation:

Surgical Technologists

• Medical Equipment Preparer



#### Surgical Technologists (29-2055)

Assist in operations, under the supervision of surgeons, registered nurses, or other surgical personnel. May help set up operating room, prepare and transport patients for surgery, adjust lights and equipment, pass instruments and other supplies to surgeons and surgeon's assistants, hold retractors, cut sutures, and help count sponges, needles, supplies, and instruments.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: Postsecondary nondegree award

Training Requirement: None

Percentage of incumbent workers with a Community College Award or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 56%

#### **Medical Equipment Preparers (31-9093)**

Prepare, sterilize, install, or clean laboratory or healthcare equipment. May perform routine laboratory tasks and operate or inspect equipment.

Sample job titles: Central Processing Technician (CPT), Central Service Technician (CST), Central Sterile Supply Technician (CSS Technician), Certified Registered Central Service Technician (CRCST), Instrument Technician, Sterile Preparation Technician, Sterile Processing and Distribution Technician (SPD Technician), Sterile Processing Technician, Sterile Technician, Sterilization Technician

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: HS diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: One to twelve months on-the-job training

Percentage of incumbent workers with a Community College Award or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 40%

### **Job Opportunities**

In 2017, there were nearly 1,400 surgical technologists and medical equipment preparers jobs in the Inland Empire/Desert Region. This occupational group is projecting an increase in employment of

22% by 2022. Employers in the region will need to hire more than 1,000 workers over the next five years to fill new jobs and backfill jobs that workers are vacating (includes permanent job changes and retirements). Exhibit 1 shows the projected growth for both occupations.

Over the last 12 months (March 2017 to February 2018), there were 343 advertisements (ads) for surgical technologists and medical equipment preparers jobs in the Inland Empire/Desert Region. In the full-year 2017, there were 405 job ads; 430 job ads in 2016; 257 job ads in 2015; and 198 job ads in 2014. Exhibit 2 shows the number of job ads posted during the last 12 months for each of these occupations.

#### **Earnings**

The entry-level wage for both occupations is above the MIT Living Wage estimate for a single adult living in the Inland Empire/Desert Region (\$12.30 per hour or \$25,584 annually). These wages are Surgical Technologists and Medical Equipment Preparers in the Inland Empire/Desert Region, March 2018



also sufficient for an adult living in a household with one other working adult and one child (\$14.50 per hour, per adult or \$30,160 annually for each adult). See Exhibit 3 for wage information for the two-county region.

Exhibit 6 displays the entry-level education level education typically required to enter each occupation according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics. The U.S. Census supplies educational attainment for incumbent workers with "some college, no degree" and an "associate degree." The minimum advertised education requirement requested by employers is from online job ads.
