Inland Empire/Desert Region (Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario Metropolitan Statistical Area) and Los Angeles/Orange County Region (Los Angeles-Long Beach-Anaheim Metropolitan Statistical Area)

Summary

- The occupation of photographers is projected to have **717 job openings** over the next five years (2017-2022) in the Inland Empire/Desert Region.
- The entry-level wage for photographers is above the MIT Living Wage estimate of \$12.30
 per hour for a single adult living in the Inland Empire/Desert Region.
- There appears to be an opportunity for program growth based on the average annual number of program completions for the selected community college programs (41 average annual community college credentials), and the annual openings for photographers in the region (143 annual job openings).

Introduction

The occupation detailed in this report is listed below along with its corresponding definition/description, sample job titles, education and training requirements, as well as the community college educational attainment of current workers within this occupation:

Photographers (27-4021)

Photograph people, landscapes, merchandise, or other subjects, using digital or film cameras and equipment. May develop negatives or use computer software to produce finished images and prints. Includes scientific photographers, aerial photographers, and photojournalists.

Sample job titles: Advertising Photographer, Commercial Photographer, Newspaper Photographer, Owner/Photographer, Photographer, Photographer, Photographer, Photographer, Sports Photographer, Studio Owner

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: More than 12 months on-the-job-training

Percentage of incumbent workers with a Community College Credential or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 35%



Labor market demand data for Los Angeles and Orange counties are included this report in addition to the Inland Empire/Desert Region. There are approximately seven times more job opportunities for the photographers in Los Angeles and Orange counties than in the local Inland Empire/Desert Region.

Job Opportunities

In 2017, there were 12,365 photography jobs in the Inland Empire/Desert Region and Los Angeles/Orange County Region combined. This occupational group is projecting to increase employment by 7% over the next five years. Employers in the region will need to hire 6,114 workers over the projection period to backfill jobs that workers are permanently vacating (includes retirements). Exhibit 1 displays the projected growth for photographers for the Inland Empire/Desert Region, Los Angeles and Orange counties, as well as both geographies combined.

Earnings

The entry-level wage for photographers is above the MIT Living Wage estimate of \$12.30 per hour for a single adult living in the Inland Empire/Desert Region (\$13.96 for Los Angeles and Orange counties). These wages are also sufficient for two working adults and one child (\$14.50 per hour, per adult or \$30,160 annually for each adult). Exhibit 2 displays wage information for this occupation in the Inland Empire/Desert Region and Los Angeles/Orange County Region.

Job Postings, Employers, Skills, and Education

Exhibit 3 shows the number of job ads posted during the last 12 months along with the regional and national average time to fill for both regions. On average, open positions for photographers take 52 days to fill in the Inland Empire/Desert Region and Los Angeles and Orange counties combined. This is 11 days longer than the national average as whole, indicating that open positions are somewhat harder to fill locally.

Exhibit 6 displays the entry-level education typically required to enter this occupation according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, educational attainment for incumbent workers with "some college, no degree" and an "associate degree" according to the U.S. Census, and the minimum advertised education requirement requested by employers in online job ads.

Student Completions

Exhibit 7 shows the annual average regional community college credentials (associate degrees and certificates) conferred during the three academic years between 2014 and 2017, with the relevant TOP code as well as the program title used at each college, sourced from the Chancellor's Office Curriculum Inventory (COCI). Credentials granted from other educational institutions from 2013 to 2016 are displayed in Exhibit 8, along with the relevant CIP code. Please note, an award is not equivalent to a single person in search of a job opening since a student may earn more than one award, such as an associate degree in addition to a certificate. Community College student outcome information was obtained from the CTE LaunchBoard based on the selected TOP code(s) and region.
