

Labor Market Analysis for Program Recommendation Ecological Horticulture Occupations Monterey Peninsula College

Prepared by the San Francisco Bay Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research March 2022

Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an "undersupply" of Ecological Horticulture workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay region and in the SC-Monterey sub-region (Monterey, San Benito, Santa Cruz counties). There is a projected annual gap of about 16,034 students in the Bay region and 1,872 students in the SC-Monterey Sub-Region.

Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 0109.00 Horticulture programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at Monterey Peninsula College and in the region.

This report profiles Ecological Horticulture Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the SC-Monterey sub-region for a regional program recommendation at Monterey Peninsula College.

- First-Line Supervisors of Landscaping, Lawn Service, and Groundskeeping Workers (37-1012): Directly supervise and coordinate activities of workers engaged in landscaping or groundskeeping activities. Work may involve reviewing contracts to ascertain service, machine, and workforce requirements; answering inquiries from potential customers regarding methods, material, and price ranges; and preparing estimates according to labor, material, and machine costs.
 - Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent
 - Training Requirement: None
 - Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 30%
 - Landscaping and Groundskeeping Workers (37-3011): Landscape or maintain grounds of property using hand or power tools or equipment. Workers typically perform a variety of tasks, which may include any combination of the following: sod laying, mowing, trimming, planting, watering, fertilizing, digging, raking, sprinkler installation, and installation of mortarless segmental concrete masonry wall units. Excludes "Farmworkers and Laborers, Crop, Nursery, and Greenhouse" (45-2092).
 - Entry-Level Educational Requirement: No formal educational credential
 - Training Requirement: Short-term on-the-job training
 - Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 20%
- Farmworkers and Laborers, Crop, Nursery, and Greenhouse (45-2092): Manually plant, cultivate, and harvest vegetables, fruits, nuts, horticultural specialties, and field crops. Use hand tools, such as shovels, trowels, hoes, tampers, pruning hooks, shears, and knives. Duties may include tilling soil and applying fertilizers; transplanting,

weeding, thinning, or pruning crops; applying pesticides; or cleaning, grading, sorting, packing, and loading harvested products. May construct trellises, repair fences and farm buildings, or participate in irrigation activities. Excludes "Graders and Sorters, Agricultural Products" (45-2041) and "Forest, Conservation, and Logging Workers" (45-4011 through 45-4029).

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: No formal educational credential Training Requirement: Short-term on-the-job training Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 14%

Gap Analysis

Based on the data included in this report, there is a large labor market gap in the Bay region with 16,094 annual openings for the Ecological Horticulture occupational cluster and 60 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 16,034 students. In the SC-Monterey Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 1,892 annual openings and 20 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 1,872 students.

Occupations for this report were identified by use of skills listed in O*Net descriptions and job descriptions in Burning Glass. Labor demand data is sourced from Economic Modeling Specialists International (EMSI) occupation data and Burning Glass job postings data. Educational supply and student outcomes data is retrieved from multiple sources, including CTE Launchboard and CCCCO Data Mart.
