

# Business Information Worker Occupations Labor Market Information Report Monterey Peninsula College

Prepared by the San Francisco Bay Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research 11/29/2018

## Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be a significant undersupply of Business Information workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay region and in the SC-Monterey sub-region (Monterey, San Benito, and Santa Cruz Counties). The gap is about 14,958 students annually in the Bay region and 2,156 in the SC-Monterey sub-region.

There is a labor market gap in the Bay region with 15,156 annual openings for Business Information Worker Occupations and 198 annual awards for an annual undersupply of 14,958. In the SC-Monterey sub-region, there is also a gap with 2,210 annual openings and 54 annual awards for an annual undersupply of 2,156.

## Introduction

This report profiles Business Information Worker Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the SC-Monterey sub-region for a proposed new program at Monterey Peninsula College.

Secretaries and Administrative Assistants, Except Legal, Medical, and Executive (SOC 43-6014): Perform routine clerical and administrative functions such as drafting correspondence, scheduling appointments, organizing and maintaining paper and electronic files, or providing information to callers. Excludes legal, medical, and executive secretaries (43-6011 through 43-6013).

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent
Training Requirement: Short-term on-the-job training
Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 47%

• First-Line Supervisors of Office and Administrative Support Workers (SOC 43-1011): Directly supervise and coordinate the activities of clerical and administrative support workers.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: None

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 40%

Administrative Services Managers (SOC 11-3011): Plan, direct, or coordinate one or more
administrative services of an organization, such as records and information management, mail
distribution, facilities planning and maintenance, custodial operations, and other office support
services. Medical records administrators are included in "Medical and Health Services Managers"
(11-9111). Excludes "Purchasing Managers" (11-3061).

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: Bachelor's degree

Training Requirement: None

• Executive Secretaries and Executive Administrative Assistants (SOC 43-6011): Provide high-level administrative support by conducting research, preparing statistical reports, handling information requests, and performing clerical functions such as preparing correspondence, receiving visitors, arranging conference calls, and scheduling meetings. May also train and supervise lower-level clerical staff. Excludes "Secretaries" (43-6012 through 43-6014).

## Methodology

Occupations for this report were identified by use of skills listed in O\*Net descriptions and job descriptions in Burning Glass. Labor demand data is sourced from Economic Modeling Specialists International (EMSI) occupation data and Burning Glass job postings data. Educational supply and student outcomes data is retrieved from multiple sources, including CTE Launchboard and CCCCO Data Mart.
