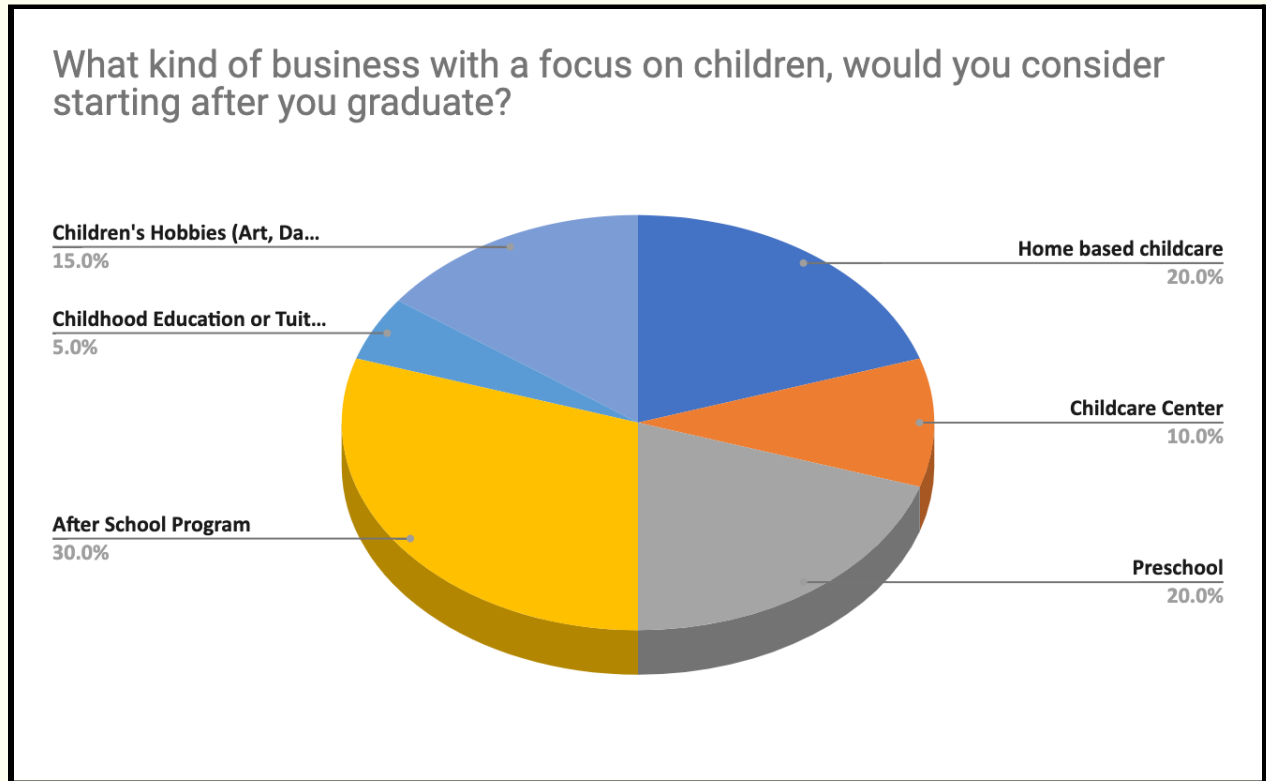
The advisory committee is composed of faculty, industry members, students (past and current), and members of the communities we serve.

Goals

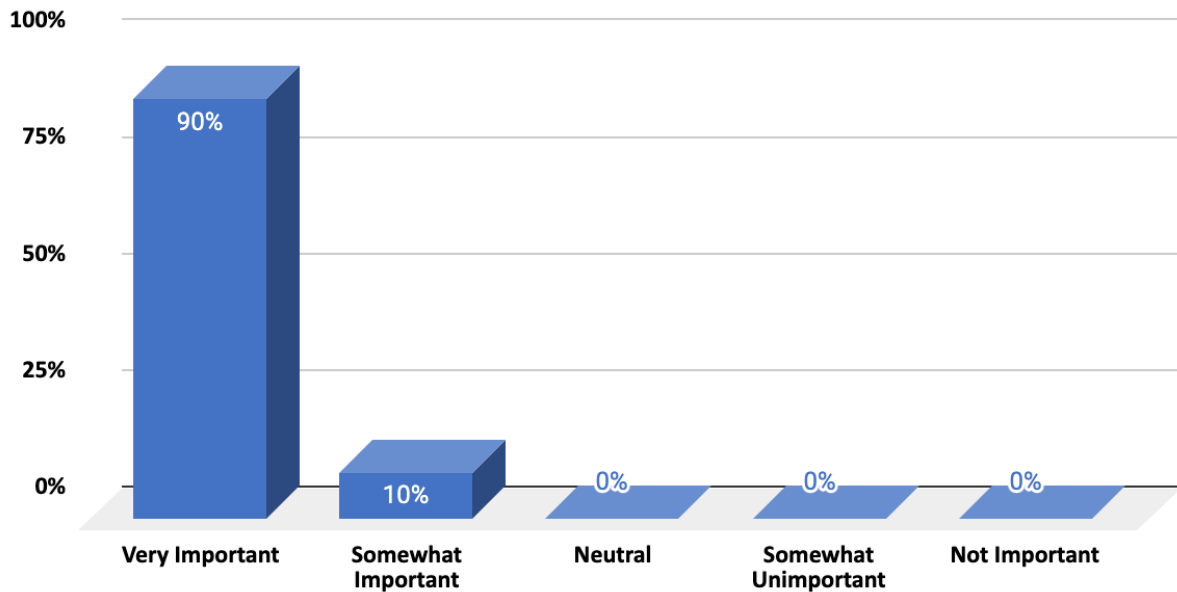
- Identify gaps in knowledge, skills, and abilities needed to launch and run a profitable business

Focus of the Advisory Committee:

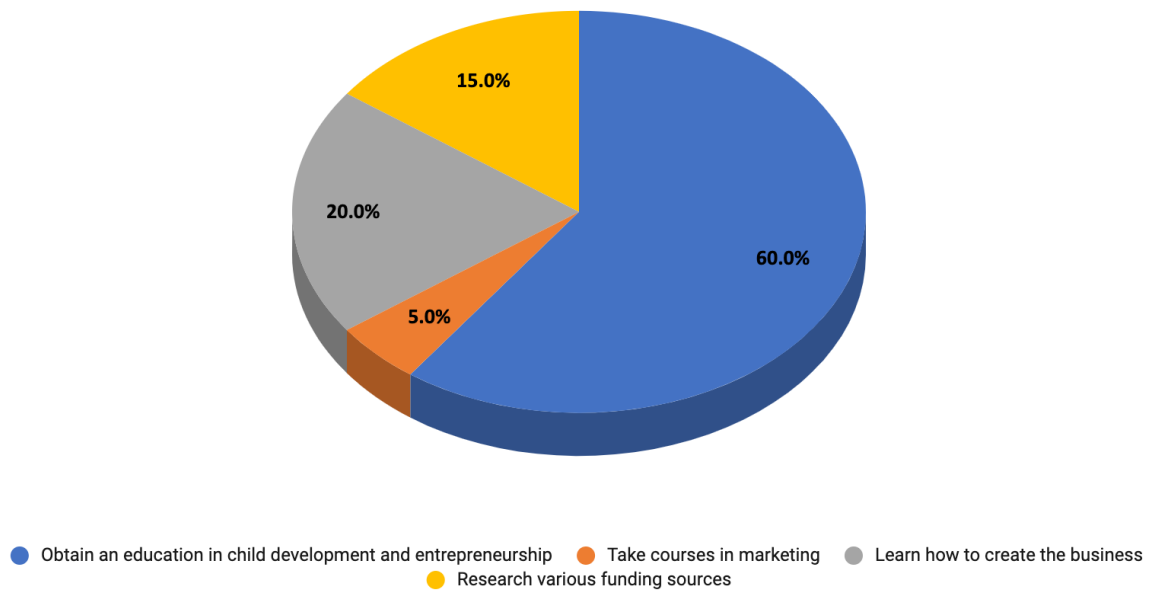

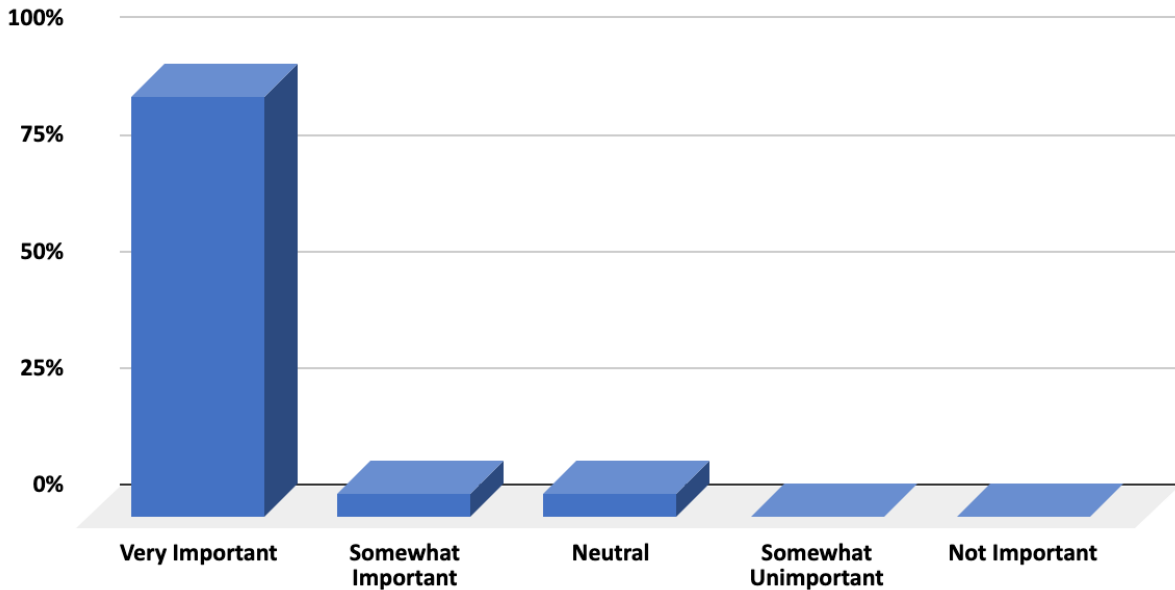
How important do you think it is for someone to get business training along with child development training? (Single Choice)



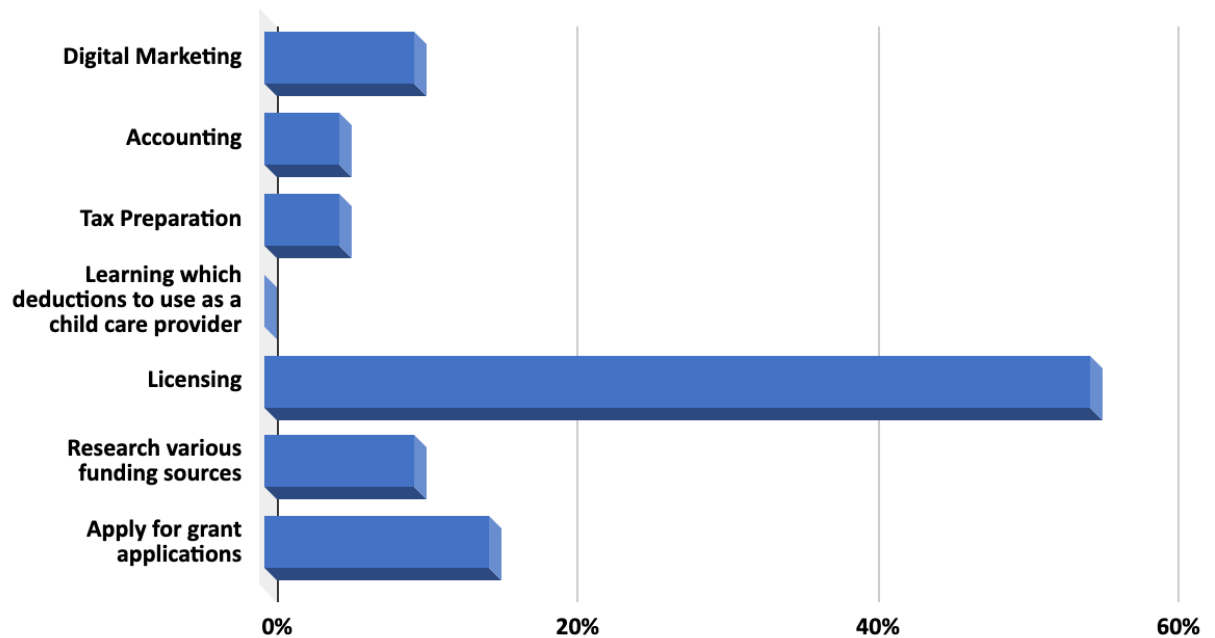
How could home-based business owners increase their salaries? (Single Choice)



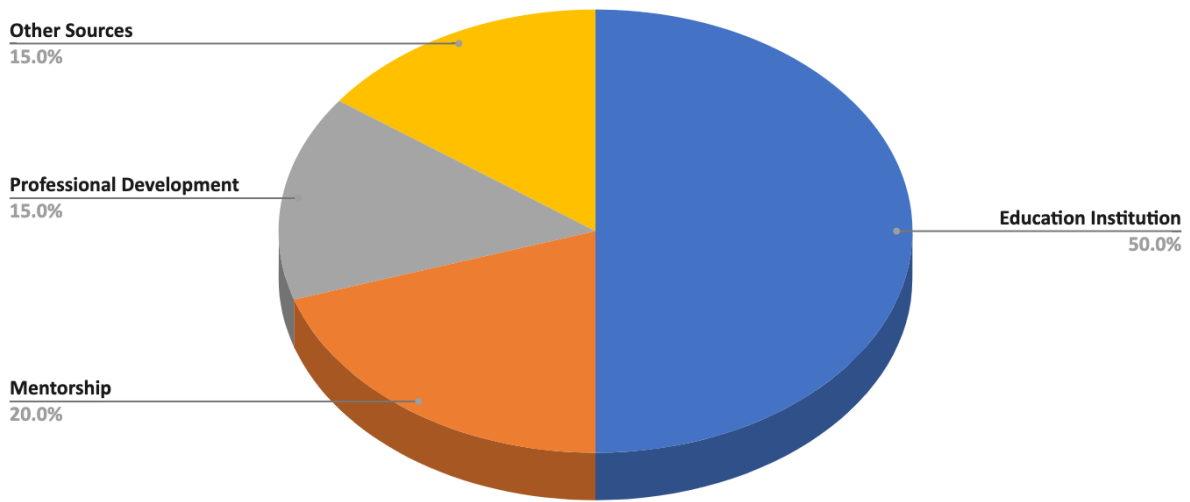
Do you think it is important for child care providers to also know business basics? (Single Choice)



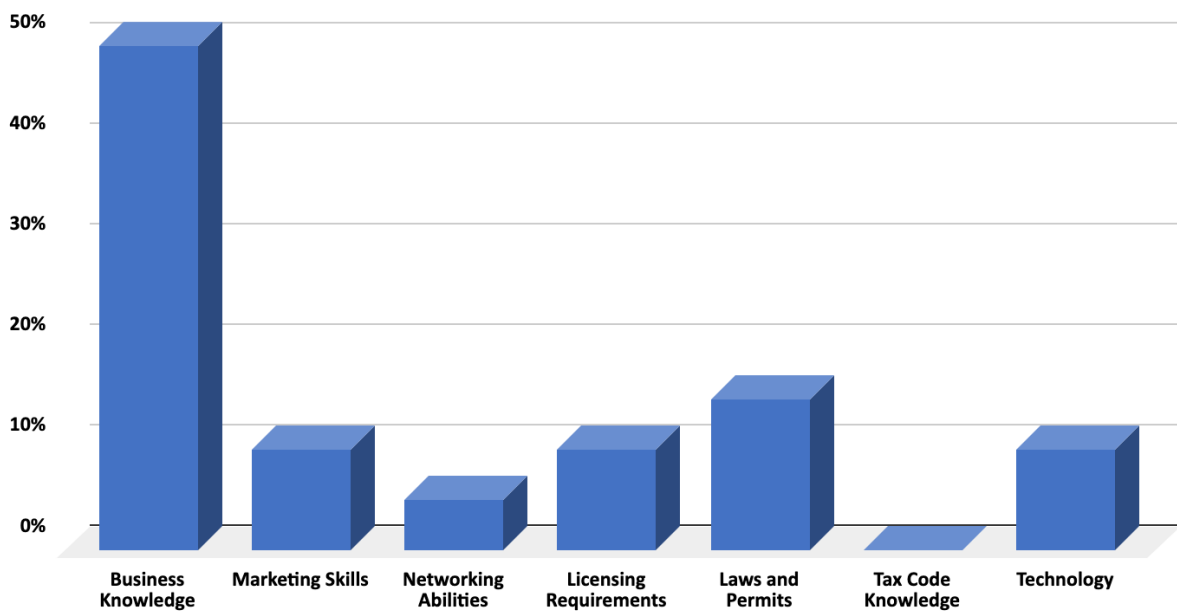
What business topics are important for child care providers to know:



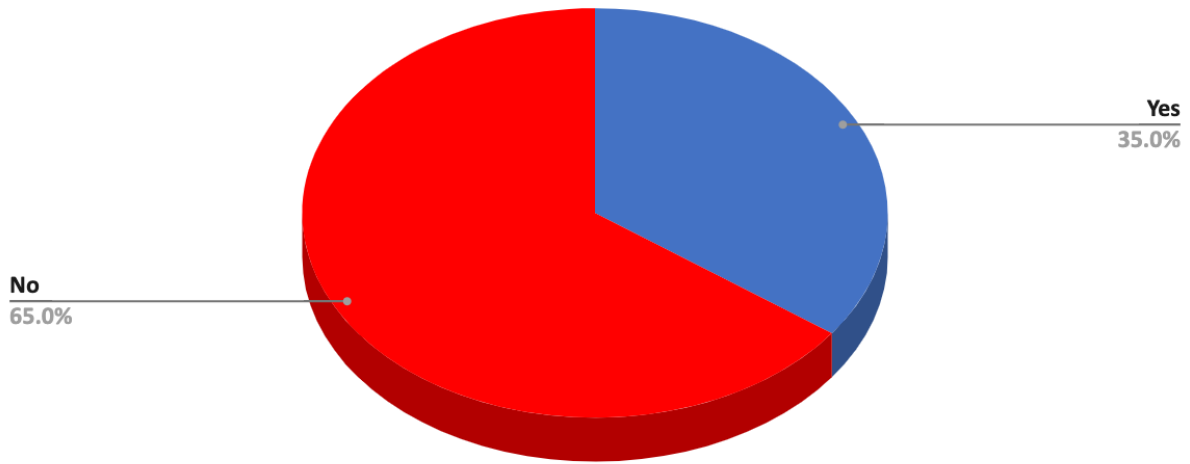
Where did you gain the skills needed to be successful?
