

Labor Market Analysis for Program Recommendation Wine Service and Wine Tasting Room Management Occupations Cabrillo College

Prepared by the San Francisco Bay Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research February 2022

Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an "undersupply" of Wine Service and Wine Tasting Room Management workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay region and in the SC-Monterey sub-region (Monterey, San Benito, Santa Cruz counties). There is a projected annual gap of about 17,248 students in the Bay region and 2,233 students in the SC-Monterey Sub-Region.

Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 0104.00 Viticulture, Enology and Wine Business programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at Cabrillo College and in the region.

This report profiles Wine Service and Wine Tasting Room Management Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the SC-Monterey sub-region for a proposed new program at Cabrillo College.

- Food Service Managers (11-9051): Plan, direct, or coordinate activities of an organization or department that serves food and beverages. Excludes "Chefs and Head Cooks" (35-1011).
 - Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent
 - Training Requirement: None
 - Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 36%
- **Buyers and Purchasing Agents (13-1028):** Buy merchandise or commodities, other than farm products, for resale to consumers at the wholesale or retail level, including both durable and nondurable goods. Analyze past buying trends, sales records, price, and quality of merchandise to determine value and yield. Select, order, and authorize payment for merchandise according to contractual agreements. May conduct meetings with sales personnel and introduce new products. May negotiate contracts. Includes assistant wholesale and retail buyers of nonfarm products.
 - Entry-Level Educational Requirement: Bachelor's degree
 - Training Requirement: Moderate-term on-the-job training
 - Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 57%

- First-Line Supervisors of Food Preparation and Serving Workers (35-1012): Directly supervise and coordinate activities of workers engaged in preparing and serving food.
 - Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent
 - Training Requirement: None
 - Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 38%

Waiters and Waitresses (35-3031): Take orders and serve food and beverages to patrons at tables in dining establishment. Excludes "Counter Attendants, Cafeteria, Food Concession, and Coffee Shop" (35-3022). Entry-Level Educational Requirement: No formal educational credential Training Requirement: Short-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 38%

Gap Analysis

Based on the data included in this report, there is a large labor market gap in the Bay region with 17,316 annual openings for the Wine Service and Wine Tasting Room Management occupational cluster and 68 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 17,248 students. In the SC-Monterey Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 2,233 annual openings and no annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 2,233 students.

Labor demand data is sourced from Economic Modeling Specialists International (EMSI) occupation data and Burning Glass job postings data. Educational supply and student outcomes data is retrieved from multiple sources, including CTE Launchboard and CCCCO Data Mart.
