

Labor Market Information Report Sustainable and Organic Food Production Occupations Cabrillo College

Prepared by the San Francisco Bay Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research

Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an "undersupply" of Sustainable and Organic Food Production workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay region and in the SC-Monterey sub-region (Monterey, San Benito, Santa Cruz counties). There is a projected annual gap of about 7,273 students in the Bay region and 1,292 students in the SC-Monterey Sub-Region.

Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 0109.00 Horticulture programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at Cabrillo College and in the region.

This report profiles Sustainable and Organic Food Production Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the SC-Monterey sub-region for a program modification at Cabrillo College.

• Farmers, Ranchers, and Other Agricultural Managers (11-9013): Plan, direct, or coordinate the management or operation of farms, ranches, greenhouses, aquacultural operations, nurseries, timber tracts, or other agricultural establishments. May hire, train, and supervise farm workers or contract for services to carry out the day-to-day activities of the managed operation. May engage in or supervise planting, cultivating, harvesting, and financial and marketing activities. Excludes "First-Line Supervisors of Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Workers" (45-1011).

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: None

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 32%

• Landscaping and Groundskeeping Workers (37-3011): Landscape or maintain grounds of property using hand or power tools or equipment. Workers typically perform a variety of tasks, which may include any combination of the following: sod laying, mowing, trimming, planting, watering, fertilizing, digging, raking, sprinkler installation, and installation of mortarless segmental concrete masonry wall units. Excludes "Farmworkers and Laborers, Crop, Nursery, and Greenhouse" (45-2092).

Training Requirement: Short-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 20%

Agricultural Inspectors (45-2011): Inspect agricultural commodities, processing equipment, and facilities, and fish
and logging operations, to ensure compliance with regulations and laws governing health, quality, and safety.

Training Requirement: Moderate-term on-the-job training

Gap Analysis

Based on the data included in this report, there is a large labor market gap in the Bay region with 7,333 annual openings for the Sustainable and Organic Food Production occupational cluster and 60 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 7,273 students. In the SC-Monterey Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 1,312 annual openings and 20 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 1,292 students.

Labor demand data is sourced from Economic Modeling Specialists International (EMSI) occupation data and Burning Glass job postings data.
