

# Agricultural Field Supervisor (Agricultural Business, Sales, and Service TOP: 0112.00)

January 2021

Prepared by the South Central Coast Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research

#### **Program Recommendation**

This report was compiled by the South Central Coast<sup>1</sup> Center of Excellence to provide regional labor market data for the program recommendation – Agricultural Business, Sales, and Service. This report can help determine whether there is demand in the local labor market that is not being met by the supply from programs of study (CCC and non-CCC) that align with this occupation group.

#### **Key Findings**

- In the South Central Coast region, the number of jobs related to Agricultural Business, Sales, and Service
  are expected to increase for Farmers, Ranchers, and Other Agricultural Managers and First-Line
  Supervisors of Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Workers.
- Agricultural Business, Sales, and Service is anticipated to experience a low risk of automation for both related occupations.
- In 2019 there were 630 regional completions in programs related to the occupations identified as related to Agricultural Business, Sales, and Service and 1,341 openings, indicating an **undersupply**.
- Typical entry-level education is a high school diploma or equivalent for related occupations.
- Completers of regional or statewide Agricultural Business, Sales, and Service programs from the 2017-2018 academic year had a median annual wage upon completion of \$22,120.
- 62% of students are **employed within a year** after completing a program.
- 41% of students **attained a living wage** within a year of completion.
- 55% of students were part time, 8% skill builders, 19% first-generation, and 64% economically disadvantaged.

# **Occupation Codes and Descriptions**

There are two occupations in the standard occupational classification (SOC) system that were identified as related to Agricultural Business, Sales, and Service for this analysis. The occupation titles and descriptions, as well as reported job titles are included in Exhibit 1.

#### **Current and Future Employment**

In the South Central Coast region, the number of jobs related to Agricultural Business, Sales, and Service are expected to increase for Farmers, Ranchers, and Other Agricultural Managers and First-Line Supervisors of Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Workers.

## **Earnings**

In the South Central Coast region, the average wage for the listed occupations is \$22.61 per hour.

Exhibit 3 contains hourly wages and annual average earnings for these occupations. Entry-level hourly earnings are represented by the  $25^{th}$  percentile of wages, median hourly earnings are represented by the  $50^{th}$  percentile of wages, and experienced hourly earnings are represented by the  $75^{th}$  percentile of wages, demonstrating various levels of employment.

#### **Employer Job Postings**

In this research brief, real-time labor market information is used to provide a more nuanced view of the current job market, as it captures job advertisements for occupations relevant to the field of study. Employer job postings are consulted to understand who is looking for agricultural managers, and what they are looking for in potential candidates. To identify job postings related to Agricultural Business, Sales, and Service the following standard occupational classifications were used:

The CTE LaunchBoard provides student outcome data on the effectiveness of CTE programs. The following student outcome information was collected from exiters of Agricultural Business, Sales, and Service Program (TOP: 0112.00) for the 2017-18 academic year.

- Completers of Agricultural Business, Sales, and Service programs from the 2017-2018 academic year in the South Central Coast region had a median annual wage upon completion of \$22,120.
- 62% of students are **employed within a year** after completing a program.
- 41% of students attained a living wage within a year of completion.
- 55% of students were part time, 8% skill builders, 19% first-generation, and 64% economically disadvantaged. (statewide)

#### **Notes**

Data included in this analysis represent the labor market demand for relevant positions most closely related to Agricultural Business, Sales, and Service. Traditional labor market information was used to show current and projected employment based on data trends, as well as annual average awards granted by regional community colleges. Real-time labor market information captures job post advertisements for occupations relevant to the field of study and can signal demand and show what employers are looking for in potential employees, but is not a perfect measure of the quantity of open positions. All representations have been produced from primary research and/or secondary review of publicly and/or privately available data and/or research reports. The most recent data available at the time of the analysis was examined; however, data sets are updated regularly and may not be consistent with previous reports. Efforts have been made to qualify and validate the accuracy of the data and findings; however, neither the Centers of Excellence for Labor Market Research (COE), COE host district, nor California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office are responsible for the applications or decisions made by individuals and/or organizations based on this study or its recommendations.
