

## **Program Endorsement Brief: 0835.20/Fitness Trainer**

Los Angeles/Orange County Center of Excellence, September 2019

## **Summary Analysis**

The Los Angeles/Orange County Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research (COE) prepared this report to provide Los Angeles/Orange County regional labor market supply and demand data related to the middle-skill occupation: fitness trainers and aerobics instructors (39-9031). Middle-skill occupations typically require some postsecondary education, but less than a bachelor's degree. This report is intended to help determine whether there is demand in the local labor market that is not being met by the supply from community college programs that align with the relevant occupation.

Based on the available data, there appears to be a supply gap for this occupation in the region. Therefore, the COE endorses this proposed program. Reasons include:

#### **Demand:**

- Over the next five years, there is projected to be 3,107 jobs available annually in the region due to new jobs, retirements, and workers leaving the field which is more than the 32 awards conferred annually from regional training programs.
- Although the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) lists a high school diploma or equivalent as the typical entry-level education for fitness trainers and aerobics instructors, 34% of workers in the field have completed some college or an associate degree.

### Supply:

- There are seven community colleges in the region have fitness trainer programs, conferring 32 awards annually between 2015 and 2018.
- Over the past 12 months, there were four other related program recommendation requests from regional community colleges.

All occupations that require an educational requirement of some college, associate degree or apprenticeship;

<sup>•</sup> All occupations that require a bachelor's degree, but also have more than one-third of their existing labor force with an educational attainment of some college or associate degree; or

All occupations that require a high school diploma or equivalent or no formal education, but also require short- to longterm on-the-job training where multiple community colleges have existing programs.

### **Occupational Demand**

Exhibit 1 shows the five-year occupational demand projections for fitness trainers and aerobics instructors. In Los Angeles/Orange County, the number of fitness trainer and aerobics instructor jobs is projected to increase by 14% through 2023. There will be more than 3,100 job openings per year through 2023 due to new jobs, retirements, and workers leaving the field.

**Wages** — Typical median hourly wages for fitness trainers and aerobics instructors throughout the region are between \$23.38 and \$24.75.3 The median wage for fitness trainers and aerobics instructors is above the California Family Needs Calculator hourly wage for one adult in Los Angeles County (\$15.04) and for one adult in Orange County (\$17.36). Regional average wages are above the average statewide wage of \$26.46 for these occupations. Wage information, by county, is included in Appendix A.

Job Postings — There were 3,089 online job postings related to fitness trainers and aerobics instructors listed in the past 12 months. The highest number of job postings were for personal trainer, swim instructor, pilates instructor, and group fitness instructor. The top skills were: Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), teaching, group fitness, and pilates. The top three employers, by number of job postings, in the region were: 24 Hour Fitness, YMCA, and Equinox. Of the 3,089 online job postings, 29% list a minimum education requirement.

**Educational Attainment** — The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) lists a high school diploma or equivalent as the typical entry-level education for fitness trainers and aerobics instructors. The national-level educational attainment data indicates 34% of workers in the field have completed some college or an associate degree. Of the 29% of job postings for fitness trainers and aerobics instructors listing a minimum education requirement in Los Angeles/Orange County, 95% (839) requested a high school diploma and 5% (46) requested an associate degree.

#### Supply

**Community College Supply** — Exhibit 2 shows the annual and three-year average number of awards conferred by community colleges in Fitness Trainer (0835.20) programs. The colleges with the most completions in the region are Irvine and Orange Coast. Over the past 12 months, there were four other related program recommendation requests from regional community colleges.

 $<sup>^2</sup>$  Five-year change represents new job additions to the workforce. Annual openings include new jobs and replacement jobs that result from retirements and separations.

 $<sup>^{3}</sup>$  Entry-level wage is defined as the twenty-fifth percentile hourly wage. Wages for experienced workers are defined as the seventy-fifth percentile hourly wage.
