

Health Navigator Occupations Labor Market Information Report Merritt College

Prepared by the San Francisco Bay Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research January 2020

Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an undersupply of Health Navigator workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay region and in the East Bay sub-region (Alameda and Contra Costa Counties.) There is a projected annual gap of about 1,969 students in the Bay region and 608 students in the East Bay Sub-Region.

This report also provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for programs on TOP 1261.00 - Community Health Care Worker in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at Merritt College and in the region.

Introduction

This report profiles Health Navigator Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the East Bay sub-region for a proposed new program at Merritt College.

• Community Health Workers (SOC 21-1094): Assist individuals and communities to adopt healthy behaviors. Conduct outreach for medical personnel or health organizations to implement programs in the community that promote, maintain, and improve individual and community health. May provide information on available resources, provide social support and informal counseling, advocate for individuals and community health needs, and provide services such as first aid and blood pressure screening. May collect data to help identify community health needs. Excludes "Health Educators" (21-1091).

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: Short-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 28%

• Social and Human Service Assistants (SOC 21-1093): Assist in providing client services in a wide variety of fields, such as psychology, rehabilitation, or social work, including support for families. May assist clients in identifying and obtaining available benefits and social and community services. May assist social workers with developing, organizing, and conducting programs to prevent and resolve problems relevant to substance abuse, human relationships, rehabilitation, or dependent care. Excludes "Rehabilitation Counselors" (21-1015), "Psychiatric Technicians" (29-2053), "Personal Care Aides" (39-9021), and "Eligibility Interviewers, Government Programs" (43-4061).

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: Short-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 35%

Gap Analysis

Based on the data included in this report, there is a large labor market gap in the Bay region with 2,051 annual openings for the Health Navigator occupational cluster and 82 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 1,969 students. In the East Bay Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 608 annual openings and no annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 608 students.

Labor demand data is sourced from Economic Modeling Specialists International (EMSI) occupation data and Burning Glass job postings data. Educational supply and student outcomes data is retrieved from multiple sources, including CTE Launchboard and CCCCO Data Mart.
