

Information Technology Occupational Group

California and the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario Metropolitan Statistical Area (Riverside and San Bernardino counties combined)

Job Opportunities

In 2016, there were more than 99,000 information technology occupational jobs in California. About 5% or over 4,600 of these job opportunities were located in the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario MSA. Across the local region, the information technology occupational group is expected to increase 10% through 2021, slower than the state overall at 12% growth. Employers in the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario MSA will need to hire nearly 800 workers over the next five years to fill new jobs and to backfill jobs that workers are leaving (includes retirements). Projected job growth for each of the detailed occupations in this occupational group are found in Appendix A.

Earnings

The combined average entry-level wage for this occupational group is \$16.62, above the MIT Living Wage estimate of \$12.10 per hour for a single adult living in the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario MSA. The average annual earnings for this occupational group in the region is \$55,900 per year, assuming full-time employment. The combined average entry-level hourly wage in California is \$17.69 per hour. Appendix A contains hourly wages and annual average earnings for each detailed occupation in this group.

Job Ads, Top Employers, Work Locations, Skills, Education, and Certifications

In the last 12 months (July 2016 to June 2017), there were a total of 919 full-time job advertisements (ads) for the information technology occupational group in the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario MSA. In the full-year 2016 there were 1,014 job ads; 1,038 job ads in 2015, and 759 job ads in 2014. Of the total of 919 full-time job ads during the last 12 months, 859 job ads are from the computer user support specialists and 60 job ads are from the computer network support specialists.

The top employers posting jobs for information technology occupations were Best Buy (107) and Smartech and Associates (20).

The top worksite cities in the region were Ontario, Riverside, and Corona. Exhibit 3 lists the top specialized and soft skills that employers are seeking when looking for workers to fill information technology positions.

Exhibit 4 displays the education level requested by employers in online job ads. The majority of employers during the past year were looking for a candidate with either a high school diploma or vocational training or an associate degree, varying by the specific occupation.

- 23% of students are employed within six months after completing a program.



Summary

- Jobs in the information technology occupational group are showing positive growth in labor market over the next five years. Many more job opportunities for these occupations are available outside of the local region.
- The starting salary for information technology occupations are above the living wage in the local area.
- Many community colleges and outside educational institutions have programs related to information technology occupations, the combination of awards conferred and current program headcount may indicate that the labor market demand is being met with current programs.

Appendix A: Occupation definitions, five-year projections, and earnings for the Information Technology occupational group

Occupation Definitions (SOC code), Education and Training Requirement, Community **College Education Attainment**

Computer User Support Specialists (15-1151)

Provide technical assistance to computer users. Answer questions or resolve computer problems for clients in person, or via telephone or electronically. May provide assistance concerning the use of computer hardware and software, including printing, installation, word processing, electronic mail, and operating systems.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: Some college, no degree

Training Requirement: None

Incumbent Workers with a Community College Award or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 45%

Computer Network Support Specialists (15-1152)

Analyze, test, troubleshoot, and evaluate existing network systems, such as local area network (LAN), wide area network (WAN), and Internet systems or a segment of a network system. Perform network maintenance to ensure networks operate correctly with minimal interruption.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: Associate degree

Training Requirement: None

Incumbent Workers with a Community College Award or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 45%
