

Program Endorsement Brief: 0502.00/Accounting Payroll Accounting Small Business Accounting

Los Angeles/Orange County Center of Excellence, March 2020

Summary Analysis

The Los Angeles/Orange County Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research (COE) prepared this report to provide Los Angeles/Orange County regional labor market supply and demand data for two middle-skill occupations related to accounting: bookkeeping, accounting, and auditing clerks (43-3031) and payroll and timekeeping clerks (43-3051). Middle-skill occupations typically require some postsecondary education, but less than a bachelor's degree. This report is intended to help determine whether there is demand in the local labor market that is not being met by the supply from community college programs that align with the relevant occupations.

Based on the available data, there appears to be a supply gap for these middle-skill accounting occupations in the region. Therefore, the COE endorses this proposed program. Reasons include:

Demand:

- Over the next five years, there is projected to be 10,486 middle-skill jobs available
 annually in the region due to replacements, which is more than the 1,661 awards
 conferred annually by educational institutions in the region.
- The national-level educational attainment data indicates that nearly half of incumbent workers have completed some college or an associate degree.
- Typical median-level hourly wages for middle-skill accounting occupations throughout
 the region are between \$22.21 and \$24.03, which is higher than the California
 Family Needs Calculator hourly wage for one adult in the region (\$15.04 in Los
 Angeles County and \$17.36 in Orange County).²

Supply:

- All **28 community colleges** in the region have accounting programs, conferring an average of **1,547 awards annually** between 2016 and 2019.
- Between 2013 and 2016, there were an average of **114 awards conferred annually** in related training programs by 11 non-community college institution the region.

¹ The COE classifies middle-skill jobs as the following:

All occupations that require an educational requirement of some college, associate degree or apprenticeship;

[•] All occupations that require a bachelor's degree, but also have more than one-third of their existing labor force with an educational attainment of some college or associate degree; or

All occupations that require a high school diploma or equivalent or no formal education, but also require shortto long-term on-the-job training where multiple community colleges have existing programs.

Occupational Demand

Exhibit 1 shows the five-year occupational demand projections for two accounting occupations. In Los Angeles/Orange County, the number of new jobs related to these occupations is projected to decrease 1% through 2023. Despite this, there will be nearly 10,500 job openings per year through 2023, due to replacements.

Wages — Typical entry-level hourly wages for middle-skill accounting occupations throughout the region are between \$17.12 and \$18.66.4 These wages surpass the California Family Needs Calculator hourly wage for one adult in Los Angeles County (\$15.04) and only the entry-level wage for payroll and timekeeping clerks exceeds the Orange County hourly wage (\$17.36).⁵ The median wages for these accounting occupations are between \$22.21 and \$24.03, which is higher than the California Family Needs Calculator wage estimates for both counties. Wage information, by county, is included in Appendix A.

Job Postings — There were 30,039 online job postings related to middle-skill accounting occupations listed in the past 12 months. The highest number of job postings were for bookkeeper, accounting clerk, accounts payable clerk, and payroll specialist. The top skills were: data entry, bookkeeping, payroll processing, and QuickBooks. The top three employers, by number of job postings, in the region were: Marriot International, Inc., University of California, Los Angeles, and Vaco. Of the 30,039 online job postings, 56% list a minimum education requirement.

Educational Attainment — The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) lists a high school diploma or equivalent as the typical entry-level education for payroll and timekeeping clerks; bookkeeping, accounting, and auditing clerks typically require some college, no degree. The national-level educational attainment data indicates that between 47.1% and 49.4% of workers in the field have completed some college or an associate degree. Of the 56% of middle-skill job postings listing a minimum education requirement in Los Angeles/Orange County, 31% (5,187) requested high school or vocational training, 16% (2,678) requested an associate degree, and 53% (9,070) requested a bachelor's degree.

³ Five-year change represents new job additions to the workforce. Annual openings include new jobs and replacement jobs that result from retirements and separations.

⁴ Entry-level wage is defined as the twenty-fifth percentile hourly wage. Wages for experienced workers are defined as the seventy-fifth percentile hourly wage.

Supply

Community College Supply — Exhibit 2 shows the annual and three-year average number of awards conferred by community colleges in the related TOP code: Accounting (0502.00). The colleges with the most completions in the region are East LA, Irvine, and Mt. San Antonio, conferring nearly half of all regional awards. During the last twelve months, there were four other related program recommendation requests from regional community colleges.

Non-Community College Supply — It is important to consider the supply from non-community college institutions in the region that provide training programs for middle-skill accounting occupations. Exhibit 3 shows the annual and three-year average number of awards conferred by these institutions in the related Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) Code: 53.0301 — Accounting and 52.0302 — Accounting Technology/Technician and Bookkeeping. Due to different data collection periods, the most recent three-year period of available data is from 2013 to 2016. Between 2013 and 2016, non-community college institutions conferred an average of 114 awards.
