The Orange County Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research (COE) prepared this report to provide Los Angeles/Orange County regional labor market supply and demand data related to one middle-skill occupation: *Dental Hygienist* (29-1292). Middle-skill occupations typically require some postsecondary education, but less than a bachelor's degree. This report is intended to help determine whether there is demand in the local labor market that is not being met by the supply from community college programs that align with the relevant occupations.

Based on the available data, there appears to be a supply gap for dental hygienists in the region. Furthermore, the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) lists an associate degree as the typical entry-level education for this occupation, and entry-level wages exceed the living wage in both Los Angeles and Orange counties. Therefore, due to all the criteria being met, the COE endorses this proposed program. Detailed reasons include:

Demand:

Supply Gap Criteria – Over the next five years, there is projected to be 609 jobs
 available annually in the region due to new job growth and replacements, which is
 more than the 233 awards conferred annually by educational institutions in the
 region.

¹ The COE classifies middle-skill jobs as the following:

All occupations that require an educational requirement of some college, associate degree or apprenticeship;

All occupations that require a bachelor's degree, but also have more than one-third of their existing labor force with an educational attainment of some college or associate degree; or

[•] All occupations that require a high school diploma or equivalent or no formal education, but also require short- to long-term on-the-job training where multiple community colleges have existing programs.

- Living Wage Criteria Within Orange County, typical entry-level hourly wages for dental hygienists are \$44.04, which is higher than the California Family Needs Calculator hourly wage (living wage) for one adult in the region (\$17.36 in Orange County).²
- Educational Criteria The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) lists an associate degree as the typical entry-level education for dental hygienists.
 - Furthermore, the national-level educational attainment data indicates 59.2% of workers in the field have completed some college or an associate degree.

Supply:

- There are 4 community colleges in the LA/OC region that issue awards related to dental hygiene, conferring an average of 87 awards annually between 2016 and 2019.
- Between 2014 and 2017, there was an average of 146 awards conferred annually in related training programs by non-community college institutions throughout the region.

Occupational Demand

Exhibit 1 shows the five-year occupational demand projections for dental hygienists. In Los Angeles/Orange County, the number of jobs related to these occupations is projected to increase by 10% through 2024. There will be more than 600 job openings per year through 2024 due to job growth and replacements.

This report includes employment projection data by Emsi which uses EDD information. Emsi's projections are modeled on recorded (historical) employment figures and incorporate several underlying assumptions, including the assumption that the economy, during the projection period, will be at approximately full employment. To the extent that a recession or labor shock, such as the economic effects of COVID-19, can cause long-term structural change, it may impact the projections. At this time, it is not possible to quantify the impact of COVID-19 on projections of industry and occupational employment. Therefore, the projections included in this report do not take the impacts of COVID-19 into account.

³ Five-year change represents new job additions to the workforce. Annual openings include new jobs and replacement jobs that result from retirements and separations.

Wages

The labor market endorsement in this report considers the entry-level hourly wages for dental hygienists in Orange County as they relate to the county's living wage. Los Angeles County wages are included below in order to provide a complete analysis of the LA/OC region. Detailed wage information, by county, is included in Appendix A.

Orange County—The typical entry-level hourly wages for dental hygienists are \$44.04, which is higher than the living wage for one adult (\$17.36 in Orange County).⁴ Experienced workers can expect to earn wages of \$61.86, which is higher than the living wage estimate. Orange County's average wages are above the average statewide wage of \$50.94 for this occupation.

Los Angeles County—The typical entry-level hourly wages for dental hygienists are \$41.51, which is higher than the living wage for one adult (\$15.04 in Los Angeles County).⁵ Experienced workers can expect to earn wages of \$58.34, which is higher than the living wage estimate. Los Angeles County's average wages are below the average statewide wage of \$50.94 for this occupation.

Job Postings

There were 387 online job postings for dental hygienists listed in the past 12 months. The top skills were: dental hygiene, dentistry, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), anesthesiology, and x-rays. The top three employers, by number of job postings, in the region were: Pacific Dental Services, Smile Brands, and Western Dental.

It is important to note that the job postings data included in this section reflects online job postings listed in the past 12 months and does not yet demonstrate the impact of COVID-19. While employers have generally posted fewer online job postings since the beginning of the pandemic, the long-term effects are currently unknown.

Educational Attainment

The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) lists an associate degree as the typical entry-level education for dental hygienists. Furthermore, the national-level educational attainment data indicates 59.2% of workers in the field have completed some college or an associate degree. Of the 16% of dental hygienist job postings listing a minimum education requirement in Los Angeles/Orange County, 66% (40) requested an associate degree and 34% (21) requested a bachelor's degree.

Educational Supply

Community College Supply—Exhibit 2 shows the three-year average number of awards conferred by community colleges in the related TOP code: Dental Hygienist (1240.20). The colleges with the most completions in the region are: West LA, Cerritos, and Pasadena. Over the past 12 months, there were no other related program recommendation requests from regional community colleges.

Non-Community College Supply—It is important to consider the supply from other institutions in the region that provide training programs for dental hygienists. Exhibit 3 shows the annual and three-year average number of awards conferred by these institutions in the related Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) Code: Dental Hygiene/Hygienist (51.0602). Due to different data collection periods, the most recent three-year period of available data is from 2014 to 2017. Between 2014 and 2017, four-year colleges in the region conferred an average of 146 awards annually in related training programs.
