Program Recommendation

This report was compiled by the South Central Coast¹ Center of Excellence to provide regional labor market data for the program recommendation – Accounting. This report can help determine whether there is demand in the local labor market that is not being met by the supply from programs of study (CCC and non-CCC) that align with this occupation group.

Key Findings

- In the South Central Coast region, the number of jobs related to Accounting are expected to remain steady for Bookkeeping, Accounting, and Auditing, Clerks Bill and Account Collectors, First-Line Supervisors of Office and Administrative Support Workers, Payroll and Timekeeping Clerks, and Office Clerks, General and increase for the four other related occupations.
- Accounting is anticipated to experience a high risk of automation for Bookkeeping, Accounting, and
 Auditing Clerks, Payroll and Timekeeping Clerks, and Office Clerks, General; medium risk for Bill and
 Account Collectors and Billing and Posting Clerks, and a low risk of automation for Accountants and
 Auditors, Budget Analysts, Financial Managers, and First-Line Supervisors of Office and Administrative
 Support Workers.
- In 2019 there were 701 regional completions in programs related to the occupations identified as related to Accounting and 6,061 openings, indicating an **undersupply**.
- Typical entry-level education is a Bachelor's Degree for Financial Managers, Accountants and Auditors, and Budget Analysts; High School Diploma or Equivalent for Bill and Account Collectors, Billing and Posting Clerks, First-Line Supervisors of Office and Administrative Support Workers, Payroll and Timekeeping Clerks, and Office Clerks, General; and Some College, No Degree for Bookkeeping, Accounting, and Auditing Clerks.
- Completers of regional Accounting programs from the 2017-2018 academic year had a **median annual** wage upon completion of \$34,392.
- 62% of students are **employed within a year** after completing a program.
- 57% of students attained a living wage within a year of completion.
- +36% change in earnings for completers.
- 61% of students were part time, 7% skill builders, 32% first-generation, and 72% economically disadvantaged.

¹ The South Central Coast Region consists of San Luis Obispo County, Santa Barbara County, Ventura County, and the following cities from North Los Angeles County: Canyon Country, Castaic, Lake Hughes, Lancaster, Littlerock, Llano, Newhall, Palmdale, Pearblossom, Santa Clarita, Stevenson Ranch, and Valencia.

Occupation Codes and Descriptions

There are nine occupations in the standard occupational classification (SOC) system that were identified as related to Accounting for this analysis. The occupation titles and descriptions, as well as reported job titles are included in Exhibit 1.

Earnings

In the South Central Coast region, the average wage for the listed occupations is \$23.41 per hour.

Exhibit 3 contains hourly wages and annual average earnings for these occupations. Entry-level hourly earnings are represented by the 25^{th} percentile of wages, median hourly earnings are represented by the 50^{th} percentile of wages, and experienced hourly earnings are represented by the 75^{th} percentile of wages, demonstrating various levels of employment.

Employer Job Postings

In this research brief, real-time labor market information is used to provide a more nuanced view of the current job market, as it captures job advertisements for occupations relevant to the field of study. Employer job postings are consulted to understand who is looking for accountants, and what they are looking for in potential candidates. To identify job postings related to Accounting the following standard occupational classifications were used:

Notes

Data included in this analysis represent the labor market demand for relevant positions most closely related to Accounting. Traditional labor market information was used to show current and projected employment based on data trends, as well as annual average awards granted by regional community colleges. Real-time labor market information captures job post advertisements for occupations relevant to the field of study and can signal demand and show what employers are looking for in potential employees, but is not a perfect measure of the quantity of open positions. All representations have been produced from primary research and/or secondary review of publicly and/or privately available data and/or research reports. The most recent data available at the time of the analysis was examined; however, data sets are updated regularly and may not be consistent with previous reports.
