



Labor Market Analysis for Program Recommendation Medical Interpreting Occupations Laney College

Prepared by the San Francisco Bay Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research

December 2023

Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an “undersupply” of Medical Interpreting workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay region and in the East Bay sub-region (Alameda, Contra Costa counties). There is a projected annual gap of about 890 students in the Bay region and 216 students in the East Bay Sub-Region.

Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 2140.00 - Legal and Community Interpretation programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at Laney College and in the region.

This report profiles Medical Interpreting Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the East Bay sub-region for a proposed new program at Laney College. Labor market information for three occupations (Survey Researchers, Social Science Research Assistants and Tour and Travel Guides) requested by Laney College are provided in the report for informational purposes only, because they are not directly related to Legal and Community Interpretation programs. Therefore these three occupations are not considered for the purposes of the “gap analysis” which compares occupational demand to program supply. Only the occupational demand for Interpreters and Translators is used for the gap analysis.

- **Survey Researchers (19-3022):** Plan, develop, or conduct surveys. May analyze and interpret the meaning of survey data, determine survey objectives, or suggest or test question wording. Includes social scientists who primarily design questionnaires or supervise survey teams. Excludes “Market Research Analysts and Marketing Specialists” (13-1161) and “Statisticians” (15-2041).

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 12%
- **Social Science Research Assistants (19-4061):** Assist social scientists in laboratory, survey, and other social science research. May help prepare findings for publication and assist in laboratory analysis, quality control, or data management. Excludes “Graduate Teaching Assistants” (25-1191).

Training Requirement: None
Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 37%

- **Interpreters and Translators (27-3091):** Interpret oral or sign language, or translate written text from one language into another.
Entry-Level Educational Requirement: Bachelor's degree
Training Requirement: None
Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 30%
- **Tour and Travel Guides (39-7018):** Escort individuals or groups on sightseeing tours or through places of interest, such as industrial establishments, public buildings, and art galleries.
Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent
Training Requirement: Moderate-term on-the-job training
Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 27%

Educational Supply

There are three (3) community colleges in the Bay Region issuing 32 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2021-22) on TOP 2140.00 - Legal and Community Interpretation. In the East Bay Sub-Region, there is one (1) community college that issued seven (7) awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

Gap Analysis

Based on the data included in this report, there is a large labor market gap in the Bay region with 922 annual openings for the Medical Interpreting occupational cluster and 32 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 890 students. In the East Bay Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 223 annual openings and seven (7) annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 216 students.
