I met with VP McGowan and Dean Rawlings with the update about the issue with not getting approval from my advisory board. (I met with them yesterday).

They informed me that because it was a legislative mandate (similar to the Federal Student Aid Title IV regulations we dealt with recently) my role changes from asking for approval, to one of updating them on the legislation and how we are going to meet the legislative mandate.

I will include a memo about advising my advisory board of the approved template and how our program is going to be structured...which I did in 2 phases.

Aug. 16, 2024 I updated them with the info that the taskforce had submitted the recommendations in June to the Chancellor's Office and we expecting to hear back soon. * At this meeting, it should be noted that they were in favor of the educational requirements, it was the time frame of 24 months that is the issue they are raising. Not all folks understand that after the academy the deputies and officers going into field training that can last anywhere from 6 to 9 months. The officers need to focus on this training because if they do not make training, they lose their jobs. Law Enforcement is asking for the timeline to change to 36 months. (2 years to complete it after getting off training).

Today, I will send out the updates to the advisory board members. I will include a copy of the email I send them, along with the documents I send them in the "minutes" required from the advisory board.

I will ensure that I am present in person for Tech review to answer any/all questions.

When I contacted you in September about approving the Modern Policing Degree I was in error of my role. Normally, when we add a new program, we do need the approval of the Advisory Board to allow us to move forward. However, since this is a legislative mandate (AB89) my role is to inform you of the legislative mandate and how our college is going to meet that mandate. In AB 89 it states that if a community college has a basic law enforcement academy, they SHALL have this degree. Therefore, we will meet that mandate.

Please see the attached three documents.

- The Template recommended by the State Chancellor's Office
- The Template for MVC's plan to meet that legislative mandate
- Document explaining 2 classes in our proposal. One a new course that will meet the State Chancellor's office template, and one course that we needed to change --both with justifications.

You will see the MVC course number and name—then a CID number. Just so you know, the CID number is a state assigned number to identify courses offered by Community Colleges. Frequently, community colleges have different numbering systems, so this CID number allows 4 year colleges to recognize and transfer the course.

As mentioned during the meeting in August, if any of your area community colleges have questions, I would be more than happy to work with them.

- By virtue of AB 89, community colleges in the state are being given an opportunity to have more influence over the training and education of future police officers. This education should include courses pertinent to CIP Code 43.0107 - Police Science.

Identified need for new TOP Code for Associate and future Bachelor Degree.

- Allow for CPL as appropriate - current model allows for up to 12 units credit.
