The Inland Empire/Desert Regional Consortium comprises the 12 community colleges in Riverside and San Bernardino counties. The California Community College Chancellor's Office requires that all requests for new CTE program approvals include a recommendation from the "appropriate CTE Regional Consortium" (PCAH 8th Edition, page 26). This recommendation ensures program offerings meet regional labor market needs and do not unnecessarily duplicate programs.

The IE/DRC vested responsibility for recommending new programs, program revisions, and other program matters with its CTE Deans subcommittee (click here to see [IE/DRC Governance](#)).

Comments/discussion: Kristy Paine shared an overview of the Modern Policing A.S. Degree.

Modern Policing Degree AB89 passed on 2021-22, increasing the minimum age for peace officers to 21 years, and minimum educational requirements to a Modern Policing Associate Degree AND a Bachelor Degree. AB852 failed leaving adherence to the original language beginning approximately on November 1, 2025 (2 years from submission of CCCCO Recommendations). College will need to articulate, or begin to do so as soon as possible in an attempt to have the degree listed in the Fall 2025 catalog.
